INTRODUCTORY NOTE

21.01.01 Dr. R. Sudha Periathai, The Chairman, gave an introductory note in which she presented the following:

- ❖ The institution continues to uphold its commitment to academic excellence, offering 21 Undergraduate Programmes, 13 Postgraduate Programmes, 8 Ph.D. Programmes, along with 35 Certificate Programmes, 7 Diploma Programmes, 14 YWED Courses and 16 Skill Development Courses.
- ❖ Serves 2,720 students through its academic programmes supported by 171 teaching faculty members, including 110 doctoral degree holders, 41 research supervisors, and 47 NET-qualified faculty members.
- ❖ 80 research scholars are currently pursuing Ph.D. programmes in the institution.

- ❖ 159 non-teaching staff members provide administrative and support services for the effective functioning of the college.
- ❖ The institution has been reaccredited by NAAC with A+ Grade (CGPA 3.31) in the Fourth Cycle (2021).
- ❖ The institution has been recognized as a "College with Potential for Excellence." by the University Grants Commission (UGC)
- ❖ The institution been granted extension of autonomous status by the UGC for a period of ten years (2022–2023 to 2031–2032).

 - Gold Zone and Silver Zone Awards for outstanding voluntary contribution towards the empowerment initiatives of the Indian Association for the Blind through the sale of flags.
 - Best Green & Clean Campus Award from Environment Solutions.
 - Inspection Certificate awarded by the Nature Science Foundation (NSF) following eight comprehensive audits.

General Recommendation

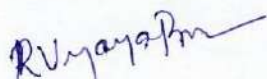
- Dr. S. Senthilnathan recommended balancing credits and contact hours by either increasing credits or reducing contact hours to ensure parity between student workload and credit allocation.
- Dr. V. Balamurugan recommended that Lecture and Tutorial hours be distributed among units based on their weightage rather than uniformly.
- CA. Chitra K suggested that the duration of internships may be extended, wherever necessary, based on the requirements of the respective disciplines, as the present duration of 15 days may not be adequate, particularly for students in the Humanities and Sciences, to gain meaningful learning experiences and undergo effective evaluation.
- She also recommended verifying and updating all web references to ensure that the links are active and accessible.
- Dr. S. Senthilnathan recommended providing complete URLs from standard and reliable sources instead of shortened links and avoiding references copied directly from search engines.
- The Council observed that the year of publication is missing in certain textbooks and recommended including the latest editions.
- The Council suggested that the achievements of faculty members may be reported in the Academic Council meetings to recognize and encourage their contributions.
- Dr. S. Senthilnathan suggested creating awareness among students across all disciplines regarding the Prime Minister's Internship Scheme (PMIS) and facilitating access to internship opportunities, stipends, and other benefits available through the scheme.

Appreciation

- The Council appreciated the inclusion of internship components in the curriculum and emphasized the need to ensure meaningful and productive outcomes.
- The Council appreciated the efforts taken by the Institution & Department of Psychology in providing counselling support to students through professional counsellors and its contributions towards promoting mental health and well-being on the campus through counselling sessions, guest lectures, awareness programmes, and related initiatives.
- The Council members appreciated the Systematic organization of the Academic Council meeting and lauded the committed management and dedicated faculty. They expressed their confidence that the institution would continue to scale greater heights in the years ahead.

All the alterations and additions to regulations and curriculum of The Standard Fireworks Rajaratnam College for women, Sivakasi were approved and they will come into effect from the academic year 2026-2027.
