
Consolidated Report on the Alumnae Feedback - 2024-2025

The Consolidated Alumnae Feedback Report compiles responses from former students regarding the college's curriculum, teaching, resources, and facilities. The feedback also addresses the effectiveness of Outcome-Based Education, the availability of job-oriented courses, and the quality of placement services. This report is intended to offer valuable insights for institutional improvement, ensuring the college continues to deliver a high-quality educational experience.

Our curriculum is designed to provide students with a well-rounded education by integrating communication and soft skills. We actively cultivate an environment that fosters strong communication abilities, preparing students for success in their academic, professional, and social lives. Alumnae feedback consistently validates this approach. Out of 185 alumnae respondents, 71 strongly agreed that Communicative English helps in building better inter-relationships in the workplace, while 100 agreed. Fourteen respondents partially agreed, and none disagreed.


Content of the curriculum is career oriented and inculcates Entrepreneurship.

Seven respondents partially agreed, while none disagreed.


Curriculum is Outcome based and all expected Course Outcomes and Programme Outcomes are attained.

Our **Outcome-Based Education** (OBE) approach is designed to enhance the quality of education and improve student learning. By promoting a goal-oriented method of teaching and learning, we better prepare students for real-world challenges. The primary aim is to introduce students to diverse career and entrepreneurial opportunities while cultivating the skills essential for both employability and entrepreneurship. Our alumnae affirm that our curriculum is outcome-focused, and all course and program goals are effectively met. Ninety-four alumnae strongly agreed that the curriculum is outcome-based and achieves the expected course and programme outcomes. Eighty-five agreed, six partially agreed, and none disagreed.


Educational resources available in the college are –

Our institution offers students extensive educational resources, including a well-stocked library with a wide selection of books, journals, magazines, newspapers, and various online sources. Alumnae consistently praise the abundance of educational resources available at our college. When asked about the educational resources in the college, 107 alumnae rated them as excellent, 57 as very good, 19 as good, and 2 as fair.

Elective courses provide basic knowledge about other disciplines.


Elective and non-major elective courses are a core component of both our undergraduate and postgraduate curricula. These courses are designed to broaden students' horizons by allowing them to expand their knowledge beyond their primary field of study. Alumnae feedback consistently highlights the value and importance of these electives. Ninety-seven respondents strongly agreed that elective courses provide basic knowledge about other disciplines, 81 agreed, and 7 partially agreed. None disagreed.

Job oriented / Self Employment Courses gear up the students towards their career.

Final-year undergraduate students can choose from a diverse selection of **21 job-oriented or self-employment courses** offered across different departments. These courses are specifically designed to sharpen **employability skills** and raise awareness of various career opportunities. Alumnae consistently praise the value and importance of these courses. A total of 86 alumnae strongly agreed and another 86 agreed that job-oriented and self-employment courses prepare students for their careers. Twelve partially agreed, while only one respondent disagreed.


Placement opportunities in the college are-
Our institution offers students extensive opportunities to gain hands-on experience through campus drives, internships, career counseling, and funded projects. Alumnae feedback consistently highlights our commitment to providing excellent placement opportunities for our students. Eighty alumnae rated the placement opportunities as excellent, 48 rated them very good, 41 rated them good, and 16 felt they were fair.


Job oriented / Self Employment Courses


Rate the current infrastructure facilities in our college

Our college provides a comprehensive infrastructure, including fully equipped classrooms, labs, audio-visual rooms, an auditorium, a library, sports facilities, transportation services, and a canteen. One hundred and nine respondents rated the infrastructure facilities as excellent, 55 rated them very good, 18 rated them good, and 3 rated them fair.




Based on the feedback from the alumnae, the key strengths they identified are summarized:

- Infrastructure and Campus:** The alumnae are proud of the college's excellent infrastructure and green campus. 70 alumnae highlighted the career-centric curriculum and systematic planning.
- Individual Attention:** The **Tutor Ward system** was highlighted as a key factor in providing individual attention to students. 52 alumnae valued the individual attention provided through the Tutor-Ward system.
- Entrepreneurial Skills:** The graduates value the opportunities they received to develop their entrepreneurial skills. 54 appreciated the opportunity to grow and develop entrepreneurship skills. 76 mentioned good infrastructure and the green campus. 80 emphasized the safe environment and strong academic discipline.
